## **Introduction:**

Durgabai Deshmukh College of Special Education (Visual Impairment) was established in 2006 to conduct Bachelor's Degree programme in Special Education for the Visually Impaired under the Faculty of Education, University of Delhi and recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India. The college has been included in the list of colleges prepared under section 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the University Grant Commission (UGC) Act, 1956.

The college is established and run by the Blind Relief Association, Delhi, a premier non-governmental organization, conducting training programme to prepare special teachers for the children with visual impairment for 5 decades. The Training Centre for the Teachers of the Visually Handicapped (TCTVH) being run by BRA was established in 1967 under the aegis of National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disability (Divyangajan) - NIEPVD, the then National Centre for the Blind.

## **Ideal Location**

Named after the famous freedom fighter, educationist and a doyen among social reformers Dr. Durgabai Deshmukh, the College can rightly boast of providing an excellent environment for the teachers in making.

Housed within the same campus is the reputed JPM Senior Secondary School for the Blind, a government-aided residential school affiliated to C.B.S.E. with over 200 visually challenged students on its roll. This School serves as practicing school for the teacher trainees. Apart from the School, BRA campus has a big Multi Skill Training Centre where a host of programmes in vocational training, including candle making, book binding and stationary making, Tailoring, relaxation massage, computer training etc. are being conducted for the benefit of the persons with visual impairment.

The college also extends the facility of audio recording and Braille printing of study materials to the visually impaired students as per their requirement through the inhouse recording studio and Braille Printing Unit. Moreover, BRA regularly hosts national-level sports training and competitive events for the blind. The Government of India has also recognized the pioneering work of The Blind Relief Association and in 2012 conferred the most prestigious National Award for the Best Institute working for the Persons with Disabilities.

Thus, studying in Durgabai Deshmukh College can give a teacher in the making, an excellent opportunity to acquire a comprehensive knowledge on education, vocational training, personality development and rehabilitation of the persons with visual impairment.

Keeping with its rich heritage, the college also initiated various curricular and cocurricular activities providing equal opportunities to both seeing and visually challenged students, such as taking part in inclusive sports events, cultural activities, etc. The college is an active member of the Equal Opportunity Cell of University of Delhi and the students of the college participate in various co-curricular activities of the university and other organisations.

The college has a Learning Resource Centre (library) with rich information resources which include 4560 volumes of print and braille books, talking books, rare books, conference proceedings, research bulletins, annual reports, back volumes of journals, CDs, DVDs and e-resources on education as well as special education. It also subscribes to 20 National and International journals/periodicals on Education and Special Education. It provides ample opportunity for students and teachers to develop their professional skills and enrich their knowledge.

The library offers thousand numbers of online e-books and e-journals through NLIST program under UGC-INFONET Digital Library Consortium. For the convenience of its faculties and teachers, the library has its own website which is totally accessible for all its students. The college is also having a well-equipped resource room.

It hardly needs emphasizing that College's excellent location and the facilities conveniently available to it, provide the ideal environment for pursuing course in special education with a special focus on visual impairment. The college has close association with various National and International universities offering courses in Special Education. The college also provides academic as well as technical consultancy to various institutions in India and abroad. Above all, the College has eminent and highly experienced regular and guest faculties.

#### **B.ED.** (SPECIAL EDUCATION - VISUAL IMPAIRMENT) 2023-2025

B.Ed. (Special Education - Visual Impairment) is a two-year degree course under the Faculty of Education, University of Delhi and recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India. The course is based on the curriculum framed by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) and the University of Delhi.

Admission to the course is open to men and women from all parts of the country. The course is offered at:

# \*Eligibility Conditions

A) Candidates with at least 50% marks either in the Bachelor's Degree and/or in the Master's Degree in Sciences/Social Sciences/Humanities, Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other Qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the program (RCI letter no. 7-128/RCI/2015).

B) Eligibility for choosing the Pedagogy Course: - The candidate will have to choose only one pedagogy subject. She /he must have studied one subject from the Pedagogy courses offered by the college in the qualifying degree, i.e., Bachelor's Degree or Master's Degree for at least 200 marks and obtained at least 50% in this subject. Candidates are advised to carefully study the table 1 showing the subjects that are considered for selecting a pedagogy course.

Only those candidates will be considered eligible who fulfill both the above mentioned (A and B) criteria.

<sup>\*</sup>Eligibility of such Degrees that are not mentioned here will be considered by the admission committee at the time of admission, and the decision of the admission committee will be final.

- ➤ Candidates applying on the basis of an Undergraduate Degree (B.A. Program/B.A. Pass/B.A. Hons.) with any of the Social Science subjects studied as in Table 1 and possessing the minimum eligibility marks are advised to fill in Social Science as their Subject Category and Pedagogy of Social Science as their Pedagogy 1 option as well as Pedagogy 2 option.
- ➤ Candidates applying on the basis of an Undergraduate Degree (B.Sc. General / B.Sc. Hons.) with any of the Science subjects studied as in Table 1 and possessing the minimum eligibility marks are advised to fill in Science as their Subject Category and Pedagogy of Science as their Pedagogy 1 option as well as Pedagogy 2 option.

- Candidates applying on the basis of an Undergraduate Degree (B.Sc. General / B.Sc. Hons.) with Mathematics subject studied as in Table 1 and possessing the minimum eligibility marks are advised to fill in Mathematics as Subject Category and Pedagogy of Mathematics as their Pedagogy 1 option as well as Pedagogy 2 option.
- ➤ Candidates applying on the basis of an Undergraduate Degree B.Com (Pass / Hons.) and have studied History / Geography / Political Science / Economics or English / Hindi for at least 200 marks and obtained minimum 50% marks in that subject, they are eligible to apply to the B.Ed. Special Education (V.I.) Programme. They are advised to fill in Social Science / Language as their Subject Category and Pedagogy of Social Science / Language as their Pedagogy 1 option as well as Pedagogy 2 option. Further, if candidates have, at graduation level (B.Com. Pass / Hons), studied Mathematics for at least 200 marks and obtained minimum 50% marks in that subject, they are eligible to apply to the B.Ed. Special Education (V.I.) programme. They are advised to fill in Mathematics as their Subject Category and Pedagogy of Mathematics as their Pedagogy 1 option as well as Pedagogy 2 option.
- ➤ Candidates applying on the basis of **an Undergraduate Degree (B. A. Hons.)** With any of the Language subjects studied as in Table 1 and possessing the minimum eligibility marks are advised to fill in Language as their **Subject Category** and Pedagogy of Language as their Pedagogy 1 option and Pedagogy of English / Hindi as their respective Pedagogy 2 option.

# **Relaxations/Concessions:**

a) The minimum eligibility requirement for the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe candidates will be that they must have passed the qualifying school/degree

examination. Provided that the minimum eligibility for admission to post-graduate Courses be the minimum pass marks of the qualifying examination concerned of the University of Delhi. In the case of Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe candidates who had passed the last qualifying examination as prescribed for the equivalent examination of Delhi University for purposes of admission to the Postgraduate course of this University.

- b) That where the admission is based on screening /written test, the Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe candidates would also be required to take the test but their merit list will be drawn separately.

  Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe candidates while applying for admission will be required to submit a certificate in their own name, from a competent authority, as listed below, to the effect that he/she belongs to a Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe.
- □ District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector / Deputy Collector / Deputy Commissioner / Additional Deputy Commissioner / First Class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner (not below the rank of First class Stipendiary Magistrate)

Chief Presidency Magistrate / Additional Chief Presidency / Magistrate / Presidency Magistrate.

- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and / or candidate's family normally resides.
- Administrator / Secretary to Administrator / Development Officer (for Lakshdweep).
- c) The OBC candidates shall be given a relaxation in the minimum eligibility in the Qualifying examination and in the minimum eligibility (if any) in the admission entrance test to the extent of 10% of the minimum eligibility marks prescribed for the General Category candidates. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 50% for the General Category candidates, the minimum eligibility for the OBCs would be 45%, i.e. (50% minus 10% of 50%).
- d) All those OBC candidates who meet the minimum eligibility marks in the qualifying examination and the minimum eligibility marks (if any) in the entrance test shall be eligible for admission in the order of their merit, keeping in view the availability of seats reserved for them.
  - The OBC candidates who belong to the 'Non-creamy Layers' and whose castes appear in the Central List of the OBCs as on date, only shall be eligible to be

considered for admission under the OBC Category. (As per the notification of University of Delhi, dated 11/04/2012).

Note:- Relaxation for reserved category will be as par the Delhi University norms.

Reservation of Seats (In accordance with Delhi University Guidelines):-

#### (a) Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Castes and EWS

- i. 15% of total number of seats for Scheduled Castes and 7.5 % for Scheduled Tribes,
- ii. Other Backward Classes (OBC)- 27% of total number of seats.
- iii. EWS- 10% of total number of seats

(Remaining seats will be open for all/unreserved)

**Note:-**The seats reserved for the SC/ST shall be filled by the SC/ST candidates only. However, in the case of non-availability of the eligible candidates the reserved seats may be interchanged between the SC & ST. If still any seat remains unfilled, the same shall be left vacant. The seats reserved for the OBCs shall be filled with the OBC candidates only. Only if OBC candidates possessing the minimum eligibility marks are not available in the OBC category then the vacant OBC seats shall be converted into General Category seats in accordance with the admission schedule notified by the University.

# (a) Supernumerary Seats:

- (i) Persons with Disabilities (PwD) = 5% of total intake (1% each for the persons with low vision or blindness, hearing impaired and loco motor disability or cerebral palsy, including dyslexia\* (interchangeable in case of non-availability of candidates in the sub-categories)).
- \*As per circular letter no. Aca.I/2015-2016/PwD/533, dated 05.06.2015
- (ii) Children/Widows of the eligible Armed Forces Personnel including Para Military Forces: (CW Category) =5% of the seats in each course.

As per the guidelines approved by the Academic Council, admissions of candidates belonging to CW category, have to be made in the following order of priorities:

- I. Widows/Wards of Defence personnel killed in action;
- II. Wards of serving personnel and ex-servicemen disabled in action;
- III. Widows/Wards of Defence personnel who died in peace time with death attributable to military service;
- IV. Wards of Defence personnel disabled in peace time with disability attributable to the military service; and
- V. Wards of Ex-servicemen personnel and serving personnel including personnel of police forces who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards;

Category-V (Gallantry Awards) include: Param Vir Chakra, Ashok Chakra, Sarvottam Yudh Seva Medal, Maha Vir Chakra, Kirti Chakra, Uttam Yudh Seva Medal, Vir Chakra, Shaurya Chakra, Yudh Seva Medal, Sena, NauSena, Vayusena Medal, Mention-in--Despatches, President's Police Medal for Gallantry, Police Medal for Gallantry.

- (iii) Foreign Nationals=5% seats in each course in Departments/Colleges. Admissions of Foreign Nationals will be as per the guidelines of the University of Delhi. The candidates may contact Foreign Students Registry for the same

#### 1. HOW TO APPLY

# An applicant should take care of the following before filling the admission form:

- 1) Visit the University of Delhi website / CUET website and go to Post graduate admission Portal and register yourself first.
- 2) Go through the B.Ed. Special Education (V.I.) Prospectus available at https://cie.du.ac.in, <a href="https://www.durgabaideshmukhcollege.org">https://www.durgabaideshmukhcollege.org</a>
- 3) Check your Eligibility according to the Eligibility criteria given in the prospectus.
- 4) For online application, fill the Admission Form available on DU PG Admissions Portal / CUET website.
- 5) Please follow the step by step instructions given on the PG Admissions portal / CUET website carefully while filling the online form.
- 6) Please select the Subject Category and CUET Paper code very carefully.
- 7) Please select the Centre of examination carefully.
- 8) No Changes in the form are allowed once the online payment has been done.
- 9) After the payment is made, take a print-out of the form and bring it

along on the day of admission at the allocated institution.

#### 2. REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION

- 1) Rounding off fractions in deciding the eligibility percentage is not allowed.
- 2) Mere successful registration by the candidate does not entail right to appear in the B.Ed. entrance examination unless the payment of entrance test fee made by the candidate is verified and satisfied by the B.Ed. Admission Committee.
- 3) Candidates who have applied for revaluation / improvement of examination results or have appeared in supplementary examinations (to re-appear) will not be considered for provisional admission.
- 4) All those candidates who have appeared in the final year examination and whose results are awaited may also apply. However, they are required to produce a provisional certificate, necessary mark sheets of the required qualifications, and other documents, at the time of admission at the institution.
- 5) The candidates who do not have the results of their qualifying degree / category certificate, shall be allowed for provisional admission and given any extension of time as per the University guidelines.
- 6) Any candidate, whose name appears in the admission list, must report to the allocated institution on the date(s) mentioned for the admission list. In case of non-reporting by the candidate, the seat will be treated as vacant and offered to the next candidate in the subsequent admission lists.

As per the observations made by the Hon'ble High Court in the matter of University of Delhi Vs. Akansha Gupta & Ors. In LPA 903/2013, for those courses wherein admissions are based on the rank in the entrance examination, the candidates will be eligible for admission only if they have the results of their qualifying degree examinations.

- 7) Subject Category selected in the registration form by the candidate shall not be changed thereafter.
- 8) In case of any disparity regarding the choice of teaching subject, the decision of the B.Ed. Special Education (V.I.) Admission Committee shall be final and binding.
- 9) The candidates applying for admission to the B.Ed. Special Education (V.I.) programme shall be permitted to apply

simultaneously under UR/SC/ST/OBC Category as well as CW, PwD and other categories for which reservations /concession is admissible.

#### **Entrance Examination Scheme:**

All admissions to the B.Ed. programme will be made through CUET (PG) 2023. The merit will be prepared on the basis of scores obtained in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) 2023. CUET (PG) 2023 will be conducted in Computer Based Test (CBT) mode only. MEDIUM OF QUESTION PAPERS CUET (PG) 2023 will be conducted in English and Hindi (Bilingual) except for language. Structure of question papers and paper codes of B. Ed Special Education (V.I.) programme is shown in table-2.

- ☐ The candidate should read the Information Bulletin carefully and identify the course and the University for which he/she is applying and check the eligibility of the University where they are seeking admission. Each question paper will have 100 Questions. Candidate has to choose language English or Hindi for the General Paper.
- MARKING SCHEME: Each question carries 04 (four) marks. For each correct response, candidate will get 04 (four) marks. For each incorrect response, 01 (one) mark will be deducted from the total score. Un-answered/un-attempted response will be given no marks. To answer a question, the candidate needs to choose one option as correct option. However, after the process of Challenges of the Answer Key, in case there are multiple correct options or change in key, only

those candidates who have attempted it correctly as per the revised Answer key will be awarded marks. In case a question is dropped due to some technical error, full marks shall be given to all the candidates irrespective of the fact who have attempted it or not.

On the basis of the performance in the entrance test, a merit list of all candidates, who take the test, will be displayed on the Website of the University/Department/ College. Depending on the rank in the merit list of their respective category of the candidate, availability of seats candidates will be shortlisted for admission. Display of name in the merit list does not indicate final selection for admission. The overall merit list will comprise of candidates of all categories. No one will be excluded from the same. The Unreserved (UR) merit list will also include SC/ST/OBC/PwD/CW candidates in the order of merit.

### **Admission Formalities**

The candidates shortlisted for the admission must be present at the stipulated date and time, at their allotted institutions, along with:

- a. Photo ID Proof
- b. Print out of their filled in Application/Registration Form
- c. Admit Card of Entrance Test
- d. Two latest passport size photographs
- e. Original and two sets of photocopies of relevant documents as mentioned in Table 3 below.

# IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING ADMISSION

The candidates selected for admission to the B.Ed. (Special Education-V.I) Programme, are required to complete the admission related formalities within the stipulated period of time including payment of the requisite fee (as notified by the concerned institution). The fee structure of the college offering B.Ed. Special Education (V. I.) Course will be announced at the time of admissions.

- 1) Admission to B. Ed. Special Education (V.I.) Course will be considered complete subject to the following:
  - a) Reporting at the institution, within the prescribed time-limit and submission of two latest passport size photographs of the candidate and all requisite original certificates & documents along with attested photocopies as specified in Table- 3.

b) Payment of online admission fee, within the prescribed time-limit.

- IV. Relevant Certificates/Documents from a competent Authority, establishing the candidate's claim for reservation, for candidate belonging to reserved categories.
- V. Character certificate from the institution last attended or from any gazetted officer (valid for six months from the date of issue).
- VI. In the case of candidates in service, a NO Objection Certificate from Employer and a letter of sanction of study leave for a period of two years.

Please Arrange the Documents in the Serial order mentioned above.

- 2. A candidate, who fails to submit any of the above mentioned documents at the time of admission, will not be entitled to admission. The Admission Committee, with an appropriate written undertaking from the candidate, will have the discretion to give some time for submission of documents,
- 3. B.Ed. Special Education (V.I.) is two years full-time programme, therefore the students are not permitted to take up any employment (full-time or part-time). The employed candidates admitted to the Programme will have to produce valid sanction of leave from the employer.
- 4. As per A.C. Resolution 40 dated 24/04/1997, no student of the University shall be permitted to pursue two degree courses simultaneously either from the University of Delhi or from other University except the part-time diplomas/certificates of the University of Delhi.
- 5. All the selected candidates admitted to the B.Ed. Special Education (V.I.) Programme are required to join the programme on the opening day of the new academic session, as notified in the Prospectus.
- 6. Admission lists will be generated to fill in all the possible seats by the last date of admission as decided by the University. The Admissions shall not be re- opened, once the admissions have been notified as 'closed'.
- 7. All admissions are subject to the approval of the University of Delhi.

- 8. If, at any stage, after verification of documents and payment of fee, it is found that the furnished information is wrong or inaccurate, or Certificate(s) / documents produced are false, the consequences may lead to cancellation of the candidate's Entrance Test result, admission, forfeiture of the tuition fee, degree and initiation of criminal proceedings against the candidate.
- 9. Disputes, if any, arising out of or relating to any matter whatsoever, concerning the process of admission shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the competent court in Delhi only.

The trainees are required to adhere to the hostel rules as laid down by the Blind Relief Association.

- Medium of Instruction and Examination: Hindi / English.
- **Teaching Days:** The Course will be spread over a period of 200 actual teaching days, i.e. a minimum of 30 weeks of actual teaching in a 6-day week. Of the remaining period, 12 weeks will be devoted to admission and examination activities, and non-instructional days, 8 weeks for vacation and 2 weeks for various public holidays.

- **Timings:** All students are expected to remain whole time in their college as per the working hours of the college. During practice teaching days, all the students are expected to be in the Practicing Schools for the entire duration of the school hours.
- Attendance: Students are expected to attend the classes and other activities regularly. Leave of absence could be granted with the prior permission only under unavoidable circumstances. Leave application should be addressed to the Course Director / Principal.
